## About the Course.....

The Motorcycle Rider Education Course is an 18-hour program that teaches safe motorcycle riding. The course is designed for both beginner and experienced riders. It is required for 15 1/2 to 17 year old riders.

The course includes controls, clothing, pre-ride checks, starting, shifting, stopping, riding in a straight line, weaving, turning, riding slowly, riding on different surfaces, carrying loads, adverse conditions, and vehicle care.

After successful completion of this course, the State of Ohio skill test will be waived and you will receive a motorcycle endorsement/license upon presenting the completion card and temporary permit to a Deputy Registrar.

## Certification.....

In order to take this class students must have either a motorcycle endorsement on their drivers license or a validated temporary motorcycle learner's permit. All students must show one of these the first night of class. You will not be allowed to take the class without it.

## To Obtain a Permit.....

Visit any Deputy Registrar office and ask for a motorcycle permit packet. There is a fee for this service.

Study the Ohio Motorcycle Operator's Manual and a Digest of Motor Vehicle Laws. Go to a driver's license exam station and take the vision and written exams for motorcycles. After passing the written test, the examiner will validate the permit form in your packet. This becomes your temporary permit, and is valid for one year.

## Motorcycles.....

125 and 250 cc motorcycles are provided for the class. Students will not be able to try different motorcycles to fit. The motorcycles have already been safety tested. Students may NOT use their own motorcycles.

## Clothing.....

Students must provide their own over-the-ankle sturdy footwear, full fingered gloves, long sleeved shirt or jacket, and long pants. Helmets are provided for the course or you may use your own helmet as long as it is DOT approved.

## Out of State?

If your license or permit is from another state or another country, contact the Motorcycle Ohio office at 1-800-83-RIDER. In most cases your home state will issue you a learner's permit and you will be able to take the course.

## Cost.....

For riders age 18 and older the cost is \$25. This tuition is non-refundable. For riders 15 1/2 to 17 the course is Free, but there is a refundable \$25 registration deposit, which is returned to the student at the completion of the class.

## Refunds.....

No refunds will be given. One transfer will be granted with a minimum of TWO WEEKS notice before the class begins as long as space is available.

## Class Size is Limited.....

Classes are limited to 12 students per class, and classes fill up very fast! Register early!!

## 4 Ways to Register.....

1. Mail a check or money order for \$25 made payable to the City of Beavercreek. Be sure to include a note with your name, address, a daytime phone number and the dates you would like to take the class. Please include a second choice if your first choice is full.

Click the online registration for Parks & Recreation Classes. You must pay with a credit or debit card; a \$2.13 convenience fee applies.

3. In person at The City of Beavercreek Parks & Recreation Office, 789 Orchard Lane. Office hours are Monday - Friday from 8am - 5pm. Cash, checks, money orders, credit and debit cards will be accepted.

4. Over the phone with a credit or debit card. Call 427-5514 to register.

Payment must be received at time of registration. After payment is received, a confirmation letter will be sent back to you.

## Walk Ins.....

In every class there is the possibility that someone will not show up. That means there is space for additional students. Walk Ins are accepted on the first day of class only. We do not keep a waiting list.

Please arrive at CI Beaver Hall approximately 15 minutes before the start of class to be placed in a lottery to fill any open spaces in the class. Priority will be given to minors walking into the class.

Walk Ins must have a valid temporary permit or valid motorcycle license and payment of \$25 in cash, check or money order. The instructor can take the walk-in's fee.
