The Beavercreek Senior Center survived the hot summer months with several activities to keep the members cool and happy inside a nice air-conditioned building which also served as a cooling center when the heat index reached temperatures of 100+ degrees. We look forward to a beautiful fall, and a not-so-cold winter!

If you have never been to our Center you should make an effort to come by and take a tour. We try to offer something for everyone. The first Friday of the month is pizza/game night. This is when members gather for fun and food for the cost of \$1 per person.

Mondays offer all kinds of exercise and fitness within our walls. Exercise to tapes or a real live instructor and/or the fitness room with 22 pieces of equipment will help you get into shape. You can keep things going in the afternoon and join Patti for her line dancing class.

On a Tuesday, come to an art class with professional artist Ron Lee. Tuesdays also features bid euchre, Wii Bowling, and the pool group. The Greene County Council on Aging (GCCOA) also host a Care Giver Group on the second and fourth Tuesday.

Wednesday is more exercise, Mah Jongg, dominoes, bridge, cornhole, and the Stamp Club on the first Wednesday of the month.

On the first and third Thursday of each month, you can come play bingo and chair volleyball. Enjoy a movie on our big projection screen every second Thursday. Our own band the Beavercreek Strummers practice every Thursday morning for your musical pleasure. Join instructor Sarah Haller for knitting class, or the ever fun Pool Group. The GCCOA has a staff member at the Center as a care coordinator to offer members assistance in a variety of areas including help with understanding the ever changing Medicare program.

Fridays offer the same exercise classes, family quest, warm-up America and euchre.

Come for lunch on Tuesdays and Thursdays; sign up by 11:00 a.m. the day before. We also have health checks, Red Hats, Red Shirts, trips to Dayton Dragons and Cincinnati Reds ball games, casino trips, and other interesting destinations.

We also have special events such as Mother's Day, Father's Day, Red Hat Anniversaries, Fourth of July, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, corn roasts, sausage-gravy breakfasts, and many other special days. A lot of the above is available for free with a membership for those 55 or older. Membership fees are \$30 for residents of Beavercreek City or Township, and \$45 for others. Many of the special activities require an additional nominal fee.

The proceeds from the middle school dances and Winter Formal are always donated to a charity of BYC's choice. In the case of the 2011 Hop into Fall dance, the proceeds are set to go towards Owen's Place, the new playground that will be catered towards all – those with and without special needs.

The Beavercreek Youth Council is a great way for kids to interact and have a voice in the community. Through this organization, they learn the value of leadership, service, and character in both a fun and educational way.
