

The Veterans Memorial offers the opportunity to enshrine yourself or a loved one in a place of honor. Brick space is available for all who served their country honorably, at home or overseas, at war or in peace.

Past or present membership in any veteran's organization is not a requirement for purchase of a memorial brick.

You do not need to be a Beavercreek resident. The memorial is dedicated to all veterans who served our country, living or deceased.



How to Purchase a Brick

A 4"x8" brick can be purchased for \$100. Three lines of information can be written on this brick.

The larger 8"x8" brick has five lines available and can be purchased for \$200.

Bricks purchased for several family members or friends can be grouped together if it is possible and is requested at the time of purchase.

Information on the brick could be simple and dignified. Information can include rank, medals earned, branch of service, ship name, service years, war or battle fought.

Each brick must be dedicated to a veteran and cannot include names of organizations, businesses, schools, friends or family members. PLEASE PRINT IN CAPITAL LETTERS.

Deadlines for bricks to be added to the Memorial are:

April 30
(for Memorial Day)

September 30
(for Veterans Day)

About the Memorial

The Veterans Memorial is located at 1911 North Fairfield Road at Fairwood Drive.

The granite Monument is 23 feet tall and weighs 33,000 lbs. The black granite column represents strength. The brass globe represents all the places around the world where Americans have served. The brass flame inside the globe represents the eternal memory of veterans. The brass eagle is a symbol of freedom. The star shape represents stars on the flag. Five sides of the Monument represents branches of the armed services. The faces of the base feature the logos of the 5 branches of the armed services. The five pointed star at the base of the Monument carries through the design of the column base. The logos are placed in a counter-clockwise direction, starting with the oldest service established—Army. The Walk of History will take a visitor through the American Revolution, the Civil War, WWI, WWII, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War.
